FABC50 Document continued – Part Two: Looking at Asia's Emerging Realities

Recognising the challenges confronting the Church in Asia

The breadth and depth of Asia make it truly difficult to understand the diversity of issues that impact this vast continent. So we focused on what struck us as the most impactful realities in Asian societies. From these we identified nine major priorities:

A. Migrants, Refugees and Indigenous People, displaced from their homelands

- Asia is the scene for a booming migration industry, which operates both legally and illegally, at a very high cost to human values; so family life is disrupted and injustices abound.
- B. Families, the bedrock of society
 - Families in Asia are currently facing many challenges that threaten their tranquility, stability and unity: family values, education, poverty, inequality and regional conflicts are concerns.
- **C.** The evolving role of Women in the fast-changing Asian societies – Asian women are often marginalised in the Church and in society due to patriarchy.
- D. Gender Issues confronting the Church and society
 - LGBTQI+ people are highly marginalised, facing discrimination and social stigma.
- E. Youth confronting a new world
 - Asia-Pacific Region has witnessed a 'youth bulge'. Youth are not the future; they are the
 present. Let them find their place in Church and society, and make their contribution.
- F. The impact of Digital Technology

- Digitalisation has impacted almost all aspects of life, offering benefits and challenges.

- **G.** Promoting an equitable Economy in the face of Urbanisation and Globalisation – The challenge is how to direct the economy for the good of all, not just of a few.
- H. The Climate Crisis which endangers our common home
- Listen to the cry of the earth and the poor.
- I. Interreligious Dialogue to bring about harmony and peace on the Asian continent
 - Our pastoral work is to open new pathways on our common journey towards a better Asia and the wellbeing of humankind.

Why are the Scripture readings for Mass so piecemeal? We read part of a verse then jump to another part. Doesn't reading it like this distort the meaning of the passage?

The readings for Mass are in a book called the *Lectionary*. Our current *Lectionary* was set up after the Second Vatican Council. It uses a threeyear cycle for the Sunday readings, so over three years we hear the majority of the Bible at Mass. Its introduction states, "The present Order of Readings for Mass, then, is an arrangement of biblical readings that provides the faithful with a knowledge of the whole of God's word, in a pattern suited to the purpose" (*General Introduction to the Lectionary*, Second Edition, 60).

So the readings are not "piecemeal" but rather arranged so that we are exposed to the whole of God's word within three years. At times a given reading may not be complete—for example, the second reading for today is from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans, chapter eleven, verses 13–15 and 29– 32. This is done not only for brevity but for clarity. Those who organized the *Lectionary* thought that this excerpt made the message clearer or gave better emphasis to a point in the reading. It certainly is good to get out your Bible and read the whole section so you can see what is missing, but when the word is proclaimed at Mass, the current arrangement is most effective. •
