# LIVINGTHEWORD

- Ezekiel is regarded as one of the 3 great prophets (after Isaiah and Jeremiah). Ezekiel is both a priest and a prophet and is speaking during a time of Exile away from Home. Without temple practices, faithfulness to the Laws of God kept Jewish identity and preserved unity. Ezekiel provides a powerful image of a 'watchman', standing, watching, 'looking out' for dangers that may be approaching your family. God's family. Have you had the courage to 'say anything and warn others'? What happens without 'watchmen'? Are you challenged into action knowing that your salvation is at stake? What do you feel needs to be spoken of in your family? Community? Parish?
- ❖ To love your neighbour as your own flesh is a striking challenge. Jewish interpretation wriggled around the challenge by regarding one's 'neighbour' as their fellow Jewish citizens. This allowed Jews not to care for 'outsiders'. Ponder the essential challenge of loving everyone as your own flesh. In what ways have you wriggled out of the challenge?
- Matthew 18 is dedicated to life inside the Christian community. How is the community of Jesus supposed to respond to hurts and arguments that come from living together? A pattern is developed to avoid hurting and shaming those involved. Private conversation, then semi-private conversation and only as a last resort a public church decision. Reconciliation is not 'brooding' in silence. Is there anyone you need to approach 'face to face'?
- Have you experienced the importance of a wise person to help ensure 'every fact is established on the testimony of two or three'. Anger and resentment cripple Christian hearts and disciples. Who are your 'two or three' guides to help your reconciliation journey?
- ❖ Treating a person like a Gentile or tax collector can be interpreted in two ways. If reconciliation does not show results, do we exclude or offer continued hopeful patience? What did Jesus do?
- ❖ The goal of Christian community is to witness to the world the love of Christ with each other. The authority to bind and loose is given by Jesus to the community in the context of prayer and agreement together. Is there need for prayer and discernment with a group about decisions you (or your ministry group, parish...) are making?
- ❖ Jesus makes a promise 'where two or more are in agreement in prayer it shall be granted to them'. What prayer request would you like to share with friends? Who could you invite into your prayer / voice to God?



### FABC50 Document (continued)

### E. From the Beaten Track to New Pastoral Priorities

At our FABC 50 Conference, we bishops made concrete decisions to move towards new priorities, as follows:

- We will work towards renewing our ministries in all our local churches in Asia towards mission, by nurturing our communities in the dynamics of communion and participation, truly living out our calling to be the "salt of the earth" and the "light of the world". We hope to be able to reorient our ministries from merely serving the Church to serving the world, as part of the mission of a servant Church.
- We commit ourselves to transforming our parishes from maintenance to mission, by fostering Basic Ecclesial Communities that build Basic Human Communities. We will ensure that they are also welcoming towards the poor, especially migrants, itinerants and displaced peoples, and maintain an inclusive, gender-sensitive, and participatory atmosphere at all times.
- We will consistently heed the call to pastoral and ecological conversion, in the face of the present climate emergency, in a manner that is truly sensitive to both "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor."
- We will serve as bridges and bridge-builders, and actively work for reconciliation in the midst of conflicts. We will consciously promote the well-being of all and consistently take part in building communities that are particularly mindful of the welfare of the most disadvantaged sectors in society.
- In collaboration with our brothers and sisters of Christian traditions and neighbour religions, we will help promote a culture of peace and harmony.
- We will work with all people of goodwill toward fostering a better and a more humane world, towards building a civilisation of justice, peace and love. Our mission is to contribute to a better Asia, to work for a better world.

This finishes a six-week, summary look at this founding document for the Church in Asia. I offer this in the hope that it gives you a taste for the direction offered by this 2023 gathering of the Asian bishops. It is good we know what they share and that we reflect upon their shared wisdom. — John P Murray osa

# Dear Padre

September 10, 2023

Recently our new pastor relocated the rectory away from the church and parish office. Why is this becoming more common?

"The laborer deserves his payment" from Luke 10:7 has been traditionally interpreted to suggest that ministers for the Lord engaged in pastoral service are provided with certain basic necessities, such as a place to call home. Some priests are now choosing a distinct location in which to live that is apart from where their ministry is primarily conducted. A reason for this move is often attributed to rectories that have no clear boundaries between the private living space and the parish office.

While clergy in apostolic ministry are not necessarily seeking a cloistered existence, they do deserve the fundamental privacies enjoyed by everyone else. Sometimes this courtesy is not respected by those who have an unhealthy curiosity about the lives of their parish priests or by those who are preoccupied with being "in the know" (and sharing what they know with the rest of the congregation).

Dedicated priests can be accessible and available at various hours during the day or night without having to live in a fishbowl. Sometimes this may warrant a new rectory location or facility. especially if the pastor in stocking feet on his day off can't pour his morning coffee without stumbling into a DRE staff meeting!
