LIVINGTHEWORD

- ❖ The Prophet Isaiah becomes increasingly upset that King Ahaz (King of Judah southern part of the Holy Land including Jerusalem) is willing to enter into a partnership with a foreign Kingdom (Assyria) to fight Israel (northern part of the Holy Land). Isaiah shares God's anguish in the form of a love story: what more could I have done for my vineyard? Instead of the fruit of peace and justice there is bloodshed and war! Imagine a relationship where you have done everything you could to show your love, yet the only fruit of the relationship is pain. What would you do? Is 'taking away its hedge, giving it to grazing' abandonment or 'starting all over again'?
- ❖ Paul is writing from prison to his much-loved community in the town of Philippi. It is a Roman town occupied by many ex Roman soldiers. There is a Jewish community that is uneasy with the Christian community. There is the 'Roman–Gentile' community cautious of Christians who are perceived as 'against Rome' and setting up another 'kingdom'. Into this mix are ultra conservative Jewish Christians (Judaizers) who seek to influence Gentile converts to Christianity that they must first become initiated into Judaism, with circumcision and food purity laws, before converting to Christianity. Added to this, two prominent women in the Christian community are in dispute taking one another to court! What would you write in a letter to help this community? Do you think Paul's words would help? Paul humbly holds himself up as an example of unity and reconciliation to follow. What do you think people 'learn, receive, hear and see in you'?
- The Gospel of Matthew is leading us closer to the end of the year with 'judgment Parables'. The Parable of the Vineyard spoke to the present but pointed to the future. Those entrusted with care (Chief Priests and Elders) of God's people (vineyard) have been found resistant to the prophets and even 'throwing the son out of the vineyard and killing him' (a reference to Jesus being killed outside the city of Jerusalem). The Parable, however, is chaotic and does not reach a real conclusion. What will happen now? Who will control the vineyard? How would this be done? If the Christian Church becomes the New Israel (vineyard) it is still required to produce the 'appropriate fruit'. What do you think the appropriate fruit is of being a member of God's family?
- ❖ The Parable ends with a challenge: membership of the church does not guarantee membership of the Kingdom of God. Imagine joining a club by payment of a member's fee. What else is required?

8 October 2023

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary. This is primarily due to the fact that the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7. It was instituted to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary, in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The feast was introduced by Pope St Pius V (1504-1572) in the year 1571 to commemorate the miraculous victory of the Christian forces in the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. The Pope attributed this victory more to the "arms" of the Rosary than the power of cannons and the valour of the soldiers who fought there.

Legend tells us that the Rosary, as a form of prayer, was given to St Dominic (1170-1221) by Mary, the Mother of Our Lord, who entrusted it to him as an aid in the conflicts with the Albigensians. The Dominican Pope, St Pius V, did much to further the spread of the Rosary and it thereafter became one of the most popular devotions in Christendom. It was the same Pope St Pius V, who in 1569 officially approved the Rosary in its present form with the Papal Bull, *Consueverunt Romani Pontifices*. It had been completed by the addition of the second half of the "Hail Mary" and the "Glory be to the Father" at the conclusion of each Mystery.

During the Middle Ages, it came into being in various medieval monasteries, as a substitute for the Divine Office, for the lay monks and devout lay persons who did not know how to read.

In line with the Church's devotion to Mary, our Mother, and the Church's tradition, the Bangkok Archdiocese has its annual Rosary campaign during October, asking the faithful to pay special attention to offering the daily Rosary. As part of that campaign, they ask us to keep count of how many Rosaries we pray and register that number each Sunday at Church.

How is an icon different from a regular painting of a saint?

Generally, icon means a symbol or image. In the Church, it refers to an image depicting Bible stories or holy people. "Icons express in images the same Gospel message that Scripture communicates by words" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1160).

Even though an icon is an image created with paints, icons are written, not painted. Icon writing, called iconography, is a vocation as well as a talent. The difference between a painter and an iconographer is that iconographers follow strict rules and standards set forth in Eastern Church canon law and Christian tradition. Rooted in God's word, icons are rich in symbolism. The colors, gestures, and shapes speak spiritually to invite us to pray and worship.

Icons can be written on almost any surface, but historically most were written on wood and had a gold-leaf background. One example of this type of icon is Our Mother of Perpetual Help, which is believed to have been written in the fifteenth century. Pope Pius IX gave it to the Redemptorists in 1865, telling the order to "make her known throughout the world." It now hangs in the Church of Sant' Alfonso in Rome.

How To Pray the Rosary

Praying the Rosary

- 1. While holding the crucifix, make the Sign of the Cross and say the Apostles' Creed.
- 2. On the first bead and all the single beads, say an Our Father.
- 3. Pray one Hail Mary on each of the next three beads for an increase in faith, hope, and charity.
- 4. On the next single bead, pray the Glory Be.
- Before praying the next set of ten beads (called a decade), first meditate on the first mystery.
 Announce the mystery, imagine the event, and begin to meditate on it by itself or in association with whatever matter the mystery brings to your heart.
- 6. Pray an Our Father.
- 7. Pray a Hail Mary on the first bead of the decade, and on each following bead.
- 8. After praying the decade, pray the Glory Be. You may also want to add the Fatima invocation.
- 9. Reflect on the second mystery, then pray an Our Father on the next single bead.
- 10. Pray the Hail Mary on the next ten beads. Repeat the sequence around the rosary.
- 11. At the end of the last decade, pray the Hail Holy Queen.
