- * Advent Story. "A Kitten at Christmas". A Catholic couple were celebrating Christmas Eve. The wife invited her husband to Midnight Mass, but he declined. He thought he would instead stay at home on this cold night, watch television, and they could have a Christmas drink when she returned. His wife left early to attend Christmas carols and, shortly after, he heard a noise at the front door. Opening the back door he noticed a cold and wet kitten. He reached toward it but it cried in fear and retreated further away. He pondered to himself how he could help comfort this poor kitten. He got some milk from the fridge, poured it into a plate, showed the kitten and placed it just inside the door. He hoped to welcome the kitten into the warm and dry room of his house. The kitten continued its crying. He tried again to reach out to it, but the kitten interpreted these actions fearfully and moved further away into the cold. As the man continued to ponder how he could truly communicate positively with this kitten, it dawned on him that he would need to become like this kitten. Suddenly he realised what God had done. He jumped into his car to attend Midnight Mass and whispered to his wife: 'for the first time I've realised that Christmas is God born among us in Jesus to help us!'
- ❖ King David had unified the tribes of Israel by bringing the 'Ark' the special wooden box containing the tablets with the Ten Commandments to Jerusalem. He now thought he would build a Temple to give a proper 'home' to God. Nathan went along with this plan but God had to intervene. God describes 11 times (*I...*) what He has done. God has intervened in history not the other way around! As you approach the end of the year and consider what you would like to do next year, have you consulted God in prayer? Is there someone like Nathan who could help you?
- ❖ Paul writes of a 'mystery kept secret for long ages but now made public to all nations', bringing about obedience of faith. Is your faith in Jesus 'secret' or 'public'? At your own level of comfort, how could you witness to being a believer and follower of Jesus? Could you invite someone to Christmas carols? Midnight Mass? Mention Jesus at your family gathering?
- God zooms in from eternity to a historical place (Galilee), to a town (Nazareth), to a person (Mary), engaged to a descendant of King David (Joseph). Here is a scriptural window into the most significant historical event of eternity. God, through the angel, awaits Mary's response. What part of Mary's experience can you identify with the most?
- Mary saying 'Yes' to God's calling, and birthing Jesus into the world at Christmas, is also symbolic of every disciple. Have you ever had a 'God' moment, a sense of a significant job God has planned for you, and then 'the angel departed'. It was over. Are you living in obedience? Forgetfulness? Laziness? Fear?

NORWAY'S BISHOP VARDEN ON THE INCARNATION – A CHRISTMAS REFLECTION

The Incarnation (i.e. the Son of God became man) is the account of the mysterious union of two incommensurate entities. From the divine angle, at the centre of the word "Incarnation", you have "caro". So the Incarnation is enfleshment. It is the fact that God assumes our flesh, submits to that restriction. He who is everywhere, in whom everything was made, the everlasting Word of the Father, chooses to be specifically present in a single embodied person, and thereby renders that person, Jesus Christ, a walking epiphany, which is the great story of the Gospel that the disciples' eyes are increasingly opened to.

It's also really important to look at the Incarnation from the point of view of the flesh. What we need to remember is that in becoming flesh, the Word didn't simply occupy one human body as a guest for 33 years. But it was human nature as such — that is, flesh — that was invested with a potential for divinity. So, being a human being in the wake of the Incarnation isn't the same as being a human being before the Incarnation, whether or not one believes in Christ and whether one even knows that Christ ever walked on this earth.

According to St Athanasius, human nature wasn't working as it was supposed to work. The only way in which it could be restored was through God's chosen way of the Incarnation. The reason God needed to become Man was to overcome mortality, which is the wages of sin, and so restore to humanity that opening towards eternity for which it was made, and for which it was intended. Because human nature had been wounded and had ceded to mortality, the Word, in whose image that nature was made, needed to reinvest it, in order to reanimate that human possibility of rising to eternal life.

The Incarnation continues in sanctified lives – in men, women, and children – transformed by what they consume sacramentally by God's grace, by the grace of community, and thereby become Christs to others. The Church itself is a mystery of Incarnation. We can't emphasise enough how important it is to remember that the Church isn't just the People of God, but that it is the Body of Christ. The Church is a sacramental mystery.

The Word didn't come with a huge cry, but came as an infant. In Latin, "infans" means "speechless". All of us yearn for that receptivity to the Word coming among us.

The Bible talks about Jesus' brothers and sisters. Is there scriptural proof that Jesus was Mary's only child?

The Catholic Church's position is that Mary had only one child; her son called Jesus. Yet there are at least ten scriptural references to "the brothers of Jesus" or to his "sisters" (see Matthew 13:55–56, Mark 6:3, and Luke 8:19–21).

The difficulty is that the meaning of the term "brothers" (translated from the Greek adelphos) isn't restricted to the sharing of a parent. On the contrary, it may not only refer to other relatives, including cousins, but also to close relationships, such as disciples. This is not unlike how we might refer to "brothers in arms" as those who fought in a war together, or a religious order of brothers or sisters.

Recall, too, that Jesus and his disciples spoke Aramaic, and there is no equivalent for the meaning of "cousins" as we know it in that language. Instead, the word for brother or sister was used when referring to cousins. Thus, when St. Jerome (circa 340—420) translated the Bible from Hebrew into Church Latin, he considered "the brothers of Jesus" as cousins, not siblings. After all, it would have been the rightful responsibility of these male relatives of Jesus to take care of Mary when Jesus died. Yet Jesus entrusts his mother to the care of his beloved disciple John (John 19:26).
